

COMPLIANCE HURRICANE UPDATE

Dear Residents,

As we approach the start of **Florida's Hurricane Season (June 1st – November 30th),** we want to remind everyone to begin preparing your homes, especially if you plan to be away for the summer.

If you will be leaving for the season, please **secure or bring inside any loose items** such as patio furniture, potted plants, decorations, or other objects that could become projectiles during a storm.

Please also take note of the community's hurricane shutter guidelines:

- ACC-approved shutters or panels may be placed over windows and doors only between June 1st and November 30th.
- Shutters must be white or made of a clear material.
- Shutters installed before June 1st or left up after November 30th are not permitted.
- Shutter violations will result in a first and only notice to correct immediately.

Thank you for your attention and cooperation as we work together to keep our community safe and wellmaintained during hurricane season.



🌴 Upcoming Sabal Palm Trimming in Island Walk

Dear Island Walk Residents,

We hope this message finds you well. We are reaching out to inform you about the upcoming routine trimming of the Sabal palms throughout Island Walk, scheduled to commence these next few months.

Purpose of Trimming

Our primary goal is to **enhance the health and appearance of the Sabal palms.** Sabal palms, native to our region, flourish when maintained appropriately. Over-pruning, particularly the practice known as "hurricane-cutting," can compromise the tree's health, making it more susceptible to pests, diseases, and environmental stresses.

⊁ What We Will Trim

To promote the vitality of these iconic palms, our trimming will be limited to:

- Dead or completely brown fronds (limbs)
- Seed pods

We will **not remove green, healthy fronds,** even if they hang lower than others, as these are essential for the tree's photosynthesis and overall well-being.

🗹 What This Means for You

Residents can expect:

- A cleaner, healthier appearance of the Sabal palms
- Minimal disruption during the trimming process
- Enhanced long-term vitality of the community's trees

A small amount of vegetative debris* may be placed curbside in front of your property on the corner of the driveway or on the mulched area of the oak tree ring the evening before or by 7 am on the designated pick up day.

Please be respectful of your neighbors and store debris out of view until the designated day. Debris left out other than on the pick up day is in violation of IslandWalk rules.

On Wednesdays Collier County will pick up debris in paper yard waste bags (NO PLASTIC), in personal bins (up to 45 gal), or tied with twine in bundles no longer than 4 ft.



LAWN DEBRIS DO'S & DON'TS

Don't leave large piles of debris for Juniper. Our contract does not provide for pick-up of large amounts.

Don't allow your private landscaper to leave debris behind after they have trimmed your trees or shrubs.





Do - put **small amounts** of lawn trimmings and fallen fronds at the street in <u>front of your home</u> on Monday or Tuesday. Juniper picks up the West side on Mondays and the East side on Tuesdays.



DO – use **PAPER ONLY LAWN WASTE BAGS** which are picked up on <u>Wednesdays</u> by the county (trash day)
