

COMMUNITY PET POLICY NOTICE

Important Reminder for All Residents

To ensure the safety, cleanliness, and enjoyment of our community, please review and comply with the following pet regulations:

Leash Requirements:

- All dogs and cats must be on a leash at all times when outdoors.
- Pets are not permitted to run free anywhere in the community common areas.

Responsibilities:

- Residents (or their designated walker) must clean up all pet waste immediately.
- Pet waste must be properly disposed of in the resident's own trash container.



Restricted Animals:

- No resident is permitted to keep or maintain in their unit:
 - Bull Terriers (Pit Bulls), or
 - Any dog with a violent or aggressive temperament.

Failure to comply with these rules may result in violations, fines, or further action in accordance with community governing documents.

COMMUNITY PARKING COMPLIANCE NOTICE

Wrong-Way Parking Is Prohibited

In accordance with Florida Statute 316.195, all residents and guests must follow proper parking regulations on all Island Walk streets.

No Wrong-Way Parking

- Parking vehicles facing against traffic flow is strictly prohibited.

Correct Parking Requirement

- Vehicles must be parked in the direction of traffic.
- The right-hand wheels of the vehicle must be:
 - Parallel to the curb, and
 - Within 12 inches of the right-hand curb.



Why This Matters

- Improves traffic safety
- Helps emergency and service vehicles access streets safely

What Residents Should Do


- Stay clear of the trapping area

LAKES COMMITTEE OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES IN 2026

The Lakes Committee has in its 2026 budget funds for continuing the upgrading of our Lake Aeration System, stocking more fish in the lakes, planting more littorals, and adding one or more boat launch areas. However, as our eco systems changes we will need to adjust and treat the problems that develop. The past 2 years we have had trouble keeping up with the tape grass that dies off, is eaten by the snails and pushed to the surface by the invasive fish. That is happening in our north lakes. We just added a second treatment of the herbicide Sonar to help keep the tape grass under control better in 2026. In 2025 our water level climbed from 7.6 feet to 11.2 feet in a little over a month. Then it dropped a foot a few weeks later and that along with the hot dry weather that followed allowed for the Chara algae to grow rapidly in our Southeast lakes and it took nearly 2 months of algaecide treatments to get it under control. The technicians from our Lake Manager will keep a close eye on that and start treating it as soon as it starts to develop. The pictures below show the problems that this caused in 2025.

A small amount of vegetative debris* may be placed curbside in front of your property on the corner of the driveway or on the mulched area of the oak tree ring the evening before or by 7 am on the designated pick up day.

Please be respectful of your neighbors and store debris out of view until the designated day. Debris left out other than on the pick up day is in violation of IslandWalk rules.

On Wednesdays Collier County will pick up debris in paper yard waste bags (NO PLASTIC), in personal bins (up to 45 gal), or tied with twine in bundles no longer than 4 ft.

Lawn Debris Do's and Don'ts

Don't leave large piles of debris for Juniper. Our contract does not provide for pick-up of large amounts.

Don't allow your private landscaper to leave debris behind after they have trimmed your trees or shrubs.



Do - put **small amounts** of lawn trimmings and fallen fronds at the street in front of your home on Monday or Tuesday. Juniper picks up the West side on Mondays and the East side on Tuesdays.



DO – use **PAPER ONLY LAWN WASTE BAGS** which are picked up on Wednesdays by the county (trash day)

To access CONCUR website, you need to create an account.

Registration is simple:

[1] Go to TownSquare (IslandWalkwebsite) Under News&Events Tab Is CONCUR.

Go into CONCUR, From CONCUR click "here to be redirected to the CONCUR login portal.

[2] Fill in the form using the information as known to the HOA: these must be exactly same values as the HOA name and address. Fields marked as "Required" cannot be skipped. You can include an optional nickname if you wish to. but the "Required" fields must match the HOA data - this ensures that only owners may access the site.

[3] Fill in security questions and answers that will help you recover a forgotten password. At least one set is required.

[4] Solve the math problem and click the "Request Code" button. Your registration password will be generated, displayed, and emailed to the address you supplied.

Now that you have a password, you can go to <https://iw-concur.com> and fill in your house number - 1234 - and your new password, then click "Enter". The site will then permit entry. Once logged in, you may change your password to something that is easier for you to remember: click the "Home" tab, then "Edit Profile" to modify any information you wish to change. The "User's Guide" button can be very useful in understanding the information available on the site.

If you encounter any issues, or have any suggestions about the site, feel free to get in touch. Note that most pages - including the login and the registration pages - will have a "Help"



button in the upper-right, just below the menus and the logo. This will frequently provide a quick answer to questions about the page.
