House Numbers – Visibility Matters

XIII. House Numbers

A. House Mounted: House mounted numbers must be clearly visible for emergency vehicle purposes. Address numbers may replace the original numbers mounted by DiVosta. They must be Arabic numerals and in simple block format. The size of each number must be between 4” - 5” in height and 3” - 4” in width and no more than 1” in depth mounted horizontally. The color **MUST** be black. Numbers that are installed on the house should be installed in the same location as originally located by DiVosta or on the exact other side of the garage. If visibility is hindered in both locations, the homeowner **MUST** apply to the ACC for an alternate location on the home.

B. Stand-Alone Ground Numbers: In addition to (and not in lieu of) house mounted address numbers, homeowners may install an address sign at ground level, placed on a decorative rock, or contained in a sign device attached to a low stake. Stand-alone address signs must be positioned within a planting bed and may not be placed in any open grassy areas where they can interfere with lawn maintenance. Free-standing address signs shall not be more than 24” wide, and not higher than 12 inches.

Community Safety Notice – E-Bike Use

E-Bike Use in Community

Residents are reminded that **high-speed e-bike riding is NOT permitted** on sidewalks and pathways near lakes or anywhere in the community.

Our community sidewalks are heavily used by: Walkers, Joggers, Residents with pets, Families and seniors

Operating e-bikes at high speeds in community is extremely dangerous and increases the risk of serious accidents and injuries.

E-Bike Safety Reminder:

- Slow down when riding near sidewalks and lake paths
- Yield to pedestrians at all times
- Do not ride e-bikes at excessive speeds in the community

LAKES COMMITTEE NOTES - JANUARY 30th 2026

Wow, hope that you are prepared for this unseasonable weather that we are experiencing. It looks like it will continue into the 1st half of February. Sorry to all the Snowbirds and seasonable visitors. However, it is better that the weather back up north. Here are a couple of things that you might watch out for:

1. Our Invasive fish, particularly the Tilapia and Cichlids are not very tolerant of the cold weather so you may see some dead fish wash up on our shorelines. Sometime this also affects the Peacock Bass. If you don't notice the dead fish, you will probably smell them.

2. With the dry weather you will see more barren shoreline. The lakes level on January 15th was down to 9.0 feet above sea level. That's the lowest since 2017 for this time of year. It's usually around 10 feet at this time.

3. And with the change of season in the littorals around the shoreline you may see some browning and flattening of the plants. However, there is new growth being observed and all will be okay with a warmup and especially when we start to get more rain.

I will be stepping down as chairman of the Lakes committee in March, so we are looking for new leadership. If you are interested in getting involved please let me know. Our next committee meeting will be in the Towncenter on Tuesday, February 10th, 2026 at 10:30am

COMMUNITY PARKING NOTICE

Wrong-Way Parking Is Prohibited

In accordance with Florida Statute 316.195, all residents and guests must follow proper parking regulations on all Island Walk streets.

No Wrong-Way Parking

- Parking vehicles facing against traffic flow is strictly prohibited.

Correct Parking Requirement

- Vehicles must be parked in the direction of traffic.
- The right-hand wheels of the vehicle must be:
 - Parallel to the curb, and
 - Within 12 inches of the right-hand curb.







January 2026 was another busy and exciting month for our new 5,100-square-foot artificial turf **Island Walk Putting Green**. Activities included a community-wide Grand Opening, a Ladies' Social Event, two Competitive Tournaments, and many residents who stopped by with putters in hand to try out the green.

Open daily except during organized events, the Putting Green is in excellent condition and beautifully landscaped. Features include nine new numbered hole flags, five chipping pads, and an artificial long-grass bunker. Designed for all ages and skill levels, this newly rebuilt amenity offers both fun and challenge. If you haven't tried it yet, we invite you to come on over and give it a try.

Grand Opening Celebration

The community-wide Grand Opening was held on **January 17, 2026**, with many residents bringing their putters to experience the green for the first time. Food and beverages were provided, and the atmosphere was relaxed and social.

Board President **Anne Golino** shared the history of the Putting Green project, followed by **Marv Bomberg**, who discussed technical details and introduced the Putting Green Committee members who volunteered many hours to make the project a success: **Dave Bamesberger, Darren Davis, Dave Riepe, Harley Ruppert, P. J. Stakelum, and Marv Bomberg**.

Tournament Formats

Competitive Tournaments are open to adult men and women with more golf experience who enjoy friendly competition. A small entry fee is collected and used to fund prize money.

Unless otherwise announced, many events are **team formats**, with teams randomly assigned just prior to the start of play. This approach helps level the playing field and encourages broader participation. You do **not** need to sign up with a partner to play.

Chip and Putt Events

In December, we began introducing “**chip and putt**” events. While traditional putting tournaments consist of 18 putting-only holes, chip and putt events combine par-3 chipping holes with putting holes. A typical hole involves a chip from one of the chipping pads or the long-grass bunker, followed by two putts to hole out.

These layouts are designed to test short-game skills and have been a fun and popular addition to our tournament offerings.

Recent Tournament Results

Since our last update, participants have enjoyed a variety of putting and chip-and-putt formats, with layouts changing from event to event to keep play fresh and challenging.

January 13 – Two-Person Team Chip and Putt Competitive Tournament

This tournament featured a new format – a 9-hole circuit of 5 chip & putt holes and 4 putting only holes with the circuit being played twice. On the first 9 holes, only the best score of the team’s two balls were scored, while on the second 9 holes, both of the team’s balls were scored. The chip & putt holes were played as par 3 holes, while the putting only holes were played as par 2 holes. Par for the team score was 69.

- **1st Place:** David Riepe and Tommy Calandrella – 62 (won sudden-death playoff for 1st place)
- **2nd Place:** David Bamesberger and Bill Chisum – 62 (tied for 1st, but lost sudden death playoff)
- **3rd Place:** Mike Riley and Rick Shultz – 66 (won sudden-death playoff for 3rd place)
- **Honorable Mention:** Kent Mosier and Penny Miller – 66 (tied for 3rd, but lost sudden-death playoff)

January 21 – Two-Person Team Ladies’ Social Tournament

This ladies event featured four 2-person teams playing a best-ball format. All of the holes were set up as putting only holes.

- **1st Place:** Chris Clark and Aleta Falzone -- 38
- **2nd Place:** Chris Pesce and Freddie Zwick -- 39

January 29 – Two-Person Team Chip and Putt Competitive Tournament

This was a eighteen hole “best ball” tournament. On each hole, the lower score of the two

golfers is recorded as the team score, and the sum of the eighteen holes is the total team score. Low team score wins. 2nd place was determined by a tie breaker on the 19th hole. Due to the crisp morning temperatures, this tournament was moved to the afternoon. The warmer sunshine made for a great day and an enjoyable event.

- **1st Place:** Bill Strake and P. J. Stakelum – 39
- **2nd Place:** Marv Bomberg and Caroline Hill – 40 (*won sudden-death playoff*)
- **Honorable Mention:** Phil Grisaffi and Bill Whalen – 40 (tied for 2nd, but lost sudden death playoff)

Island Walk Men’s Golf League

In addition to Putting Green activities, Island Walk also sponsors a **Men’s Golf League**. From January through April, league matches and tournaments are held at **Stoneybrook Golf Course in Estero**. During the remainder of the year, league golfers play weekly at courses throughout Collier and Lee Counties.

A small amount of vegetative debris* may be placed curbside in front of your property on the corner of the driveway or on the mulched area of the oak tree ring the evening before or by 7 am on the designated pick up day.

Please be respectful of your neighbors and store debris out of view until the designated day. Debris left out other than on the pick up day is in violation of IslandWalk rules.

On Wednesdays Collier County will pick up debris in paper yard waste bags (NO PLASTIC), in personal bins (up to 45 gal), or tied with twine in bundles no longer than 4 ft.


Lawn Debris Do's and Don'ts

Don't leave large piles of debris for Juniper. Our contract does not provide for pick-up of large amounts.

Don't allow your private landscaper to leave debris behind after they have trimmed your trees or shrubs.



Do - put **small amounts** of lawn trimmings and fallen fronds at the street in front of your home on Monday or Tuesday. Juniper picks up the West side on Mondays and the East side on Tuesdays.



DO – use **PAPER ONLY LAWN WASTE BAGS** which are picked up on Wednesdays by the county (trash day)

To access CONCUR website, you need to create an account. Registration is simple:

[1] Go to TownSquare (IslandWalkwebsite) Under News&Events TabIsCONCUR.

Go into CONCUR, From CONCUR click “here to be redirected to the CONCUR login portal.

[2] Fill in the form using the information as known to the HOA: these must be exactly same values as the HOA name and address. Fields marked as "Required" cannot be skipped. You can include an optional nickname if you wish to. but the "Required" fields must match the HOA data - this ensures that only owners may access the site.

[3] Fill in security questions and answers that will help you recover a forgotten password. At least one set is required.

[4] Solve the math problem and click the "Request Code" button. Your registration password will be generated, displayed, and emailed to the address you supplied.

Now that you have a password, you can go to <https://iw-concur.com> and fill in your house number - 1234 - and your new password, then click "Enter". The site will then permit entry. Once logged in, you may change your password to something that is easier for you to remember: click the "Home" tab, then "Edit Profile" to modify any information you wish to change. The "User's Guide" button can be very useful in understanding the information available on the site.

If you encounter any issues, or have any suggestions about the site, feel free to get in touch. Note that most pages - including the login and the registration pages - will have a "Help"

button  in the upper-right, just below the menus and the logo. This will frequently provide a quick answer to questions about the page.
